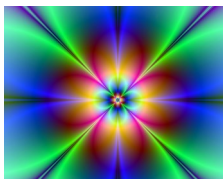
Overall our attendance for the Autumn Term was

This is fantastic and probably the best overall set of attendance for a term we have ever had.

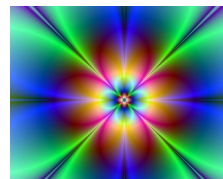
We also had over 80 children achieve their 100% attendance award showing excellent attendance and punctuality

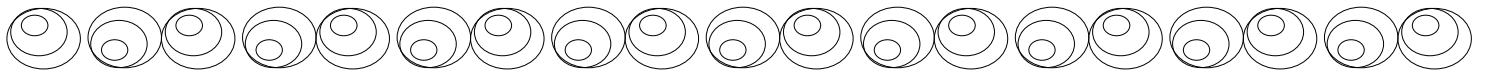

National Maths Champions

Ladbroke JMI School is celebrating after scooping first place in a National Maths Competition. A team of year six pupils entered the competition, organised by Explore Learning and NRich, earlier this year and after three challenging rounds emerged triumphant at the final event held at Cambridge University.

The school entered the competition after it was seen advertised in an edition of First News by one of the children. Vincent Lee, after seeing the article, asked his teacher Mrs Romain if they could enter. After putting in the entry form, Vincent was joined by Brooke Callaghan, Daisy Dixon and Joel Swedensky and the journey began.

The children had to make it through two rounds before making it to the final. Each round was a mixture of challenging maths problems and the ability to show resilience and good teamwork skills. In the second round it emerged that the Ladbroke team were the only team in the region who had been able to find all 102 possible solutions to the problem set. Judges observing during the rounds said they were impressed with how well the children worked together to solve the problems

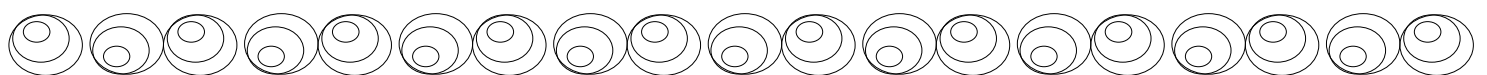
The final, held at Cambridge University on Wednesday 13th December saw the top five schools from over 700 schools that entered. Again the children showed brilliant team work and resilience solving problems involving jigsaw pieces.

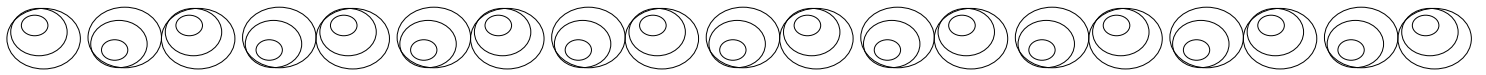
After a tour of Cambridge University and a talk by Kjartan Poskitt, author of the Murderous Maths series of books, everyone sat down to anxiously to await the result.

When the result was announced the shock and delight on the children's faces was amazing. As a result of winning the competition, they were presented with their own trophy and goodie bag, including a M.A.X. Meccano robot set; £500 worth of stationery for the school and a class trip to KidZania.

Mrs Romain, Deputy Head and class teacher said 'The children have worked so hard demonstrating their amazing maths skills. They represented our school brilliantly and we are all so very proud of them'

Miss Webster, Headteacher, said 'I am immensely proud of the children for this amazing achievement. The children really have lived up to our school motto ... work together, achieve together'

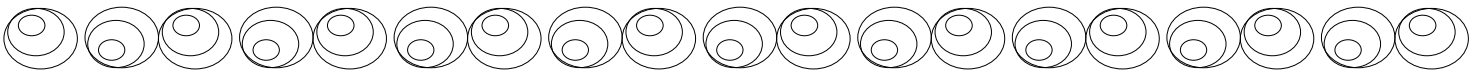
To vote, you will need to make a purchase within store of any value. You will receive one token per transaction and it's not necessary to purchase a carrier bag in order to receive a token. You may need to specifically ask for a token each time. If you do not usually shop in these Tesco branches, still ask for your token and if you bring it into school we will drop them in to make your vote.

What happens when voting ends?

We will be notified at the end of March 2018 confirming the amount of funding we will receive. The project with the highest number of votes across your region will receive £4,000, the second placed project £2,000, and the third placed project £1,000.

Thank you to all parents who read regularly with your children. We are seeing excellent progress amongst children who are reading outside of school as well as in school.
