## **English:**

The Little Red Hen:

Read the EBook on YouTube as this will give the children a better experience when reading the story.

Today you are not doing any writing!! (Some children will be pleased to hear this)

Your task is to perform a puppet show to act out the story of The Little Red Hen.

If possible, print off and colour in the character puppets provided. Cut out and then using sellotape or blu-tak attach a lollystick or straw to the back and you now have your own movable puppets. (For those without printers, you could draw and cut out your own characters or even use substitutes such as teddies/dolls/action figures to play the parts).

Now it is time to perform! Read through the story and using your puppets go through the events using them to help you act it out. You can maybe change voices for different characters and/or swap them round if you are performing with someone else.

Notes: The children may need to read the story a few times or refer back to the story if they forget what happens or they could do a quick story map with pictures as has been done previously to help them remember the order.

## **Maths (Assessment questions):**

Now that the children have looked at multiplication and division they will put their skills to the test. Next year they will have test like questions where they have to apply the skills they have learnt in year 1. Sometimes the questions can be worded differently and this sometimes throws the children off. Today you are going to work with your child to complete the **Division** questions only.

\*Do not do all the questions at once as this will overwhelm the children and therefore make them more reluctant to complete.

\*If you could like to challenge your child you can mix the questions up and get them to underline where it says either half or double and ask them what it means.

## **Topic (Our Wonderful World)**

Art: For your art task you are going to create a nature picture. Go out in the garden or take a walk and pick up any leaves, flowers, pebbles or anything you can find which you would like to use. Then create a nature picture. You can do this in any way you like. We have provided some ideas to inspire you.
