Attendance & Punctuality



Learning starts at 8.45am and it is vital that your child is in school on time.

If your child is unwell, please contact the school office as soon as possible to let us know. We will contact you to find out if an absence has not been reported.

Please try to make any appointments for your child outside of school hours.

If you do have to collect your child during the day, please come to the main office as you will need to sign them out.

If you are going to be late picking up your child, please contact us as soon as possible.

If someone different is going to be picking up your child, please inform a member of the Foundation 2 team in the morning or write it in your child's reading diary.

<u>I Ilness</u>



Children who have suffered sickness or diarrhoea should remain at home until at least 24 hours after the last episode.

Please do not send a child into school and tell them that if they feel unwell to tell a teacher. If you are concerned, let the teacher know and they will call if they feel it is necessary.

Please make sure we have up-to-date contact details for you and that at least one contact is always available.

<u>Headlice</u>



If a case of headlice appears in the school, we will inform all the families in the class.

Please check your child's hair weekly treating any lice or eggs immediately.

Please speak to your local pharmacist for the best way to treat Headlice.

All children with long hair should have it tied back during the school day.



<u>Medicines</u>



Only prescribed medicines will be administered in school. You will need to complete a permission form for us to administer the medication.

If your child needs an inhaler please make sure that the actual inhaler is labelled with the child's name. If your child needs an Epipen this should also be provided in the box with the prescription label. These should both be sent in on your child's first day.



Milk, Water & Meals



Milk is available for each child if required. If your child has their 5th birthday after 21st December 2018, your child is entitled to free milk in the first term.

Milk costs £18.25 a term.

Please provide a named water bottle for your child


Fruit is provided for your child each day

- In the summer term we recommend that no open toed sandals are worn as this can compromise the safety of the children
- Our summer uniform can be worn from the beginning of the Summer Term until the end of October.
- PE kit is not needed until the summer term.

What is Tapestry?

Tapestry is a secure online learning journal that we use to share your children's learning experiences with you.

Each family will be given a unique login so you can access your own child's learning journal. You will be able to see what they are doing and make your own comments.

You can also share your children's learning experiences with us too...



Why add an observation onto Tapestry?



Your children may have extra curricular clubs or engage in activities that would not be available at school i.e. learning to swim, spending time with family etc.





All of these experiences are having a positive impact on your child's development and we can use them as evidence of learning. We can also incorporate them into the planning of learning experiences for your children.











Accessing Tapestry

If your child is in our nursery your Tapestry account will continue as it is and your login details will remain the same.

If you are new to Ladbrooke we will need to set up an account for you.

Please email me as soon as possible confirming the name of your child so that I can set up your account.

Wake Up and Shake Up Club

- Runs from 8am every day
- Younger children are taken from the club to their classroom at the end of the session
- £4 a day
- Children can either take part in physical activities such as circuits, drama, dance and multi skills
- Children can also participate in non messy arts and crafts, puzzles and games
- Bookings are made half termly in advance (in September for new children joining the school)

After School Club

- Runs after school every day from 3.20 until 5.30pm
- Younger children are collected from the classroom
- £5 per hour
- Different activities tailored to the children booked onto the club
- Bookings are all made online and can be booked on a day to day basis as long as places are available

Children in Nursery and Reception at Ladbrooke can now benefit from a fabulous new outdoor environment created especially for them.

Award-winning outdoor play specialists, Cool Canvas, landscaped much of the existing Foundation Stage playground and installed a range of bespoke equipment. These include a brand new texture kitchen, a construction shed, bug hotel, wildflower and grass area (popularly know as our 'meadow') a Secret Garden and, most popular of all, a natural climbing structure complete with rope bridge, balance beam and monkey bars.




School Gateway

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At 12 years old it is still 30% greater


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I ncreased parental involvement can increase achievement by at least 20%
