# Nature of support 2012/2013

At Ladbrooke JMI School, we have used our Pupil Premium to impact on the standards of pupils throughout the school in all year groups. We have focused on providing extra intervention, including, for example, one-to-one tutoring for pupils who are not making at least expected progress from their starting point.

We have provided additional training for all teachers and teaching assistant to ensure high quality phonics teaching across the school and have purchased new resources to enable innovative and motivational activities to promote children's reading.

In addition to this, we are also supporting families to ensure that all children have equal access to activities within the enriched school curriculum and outside of school hours.

Results at KS1 remain consistent and are generally significantly above the national results. We are concerned about the attainment and progress of our current year two, so extra support has been placed in the class using pupil premium money to target underachievement.

There were only 5 children in the PPG group. Four of the children were working in line or above their peers. One child with significant learning difficulties impacted on the group not achieving in line with their peers

In KS2 at L4, results in reading and writing have remained consistent but the main focus of maths for the PPG last year has shown an increase of 20%. All the children on FSM and therefore part of the PPG group achieved level 4 or greater in maths last year. At L5 our results showed a similar pattern for an increase in maths but disappointing for reading and writing.

Compared with the rest of the cohort, children within the PPG group were in line with or better than their peers.
