- Continuing to undertake regular assessment of writing and moderation

Priority 2 - Play

To build better opportunities for play during unstructured periods of the day

By

- Building on strong practice in early years
- Increasing the space available for all children all year round
- Zoning our play areas into areas that promote high cooperation, collaboration
- Introduce activities that will promote children social, emotional and physical wellbeing
- Providing training for all staff working during unstructured play times
